- HOW STRONG IS GOD?
- IS HE STRONG ENOUGH TO CONTROL EVIL AND KEEP IT ON A LEAD?

'Naked I came from my mother's womb and naked I shall return. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away. May the name of the Lord be praised'. (1:21).

'Shall we receive good from God, and not trouble?' (2:10).

Job 4-37 - Job's 4 friends.

<u>Job 13:4-5</u>: 'I want to argue my case with God. You, however, smear me with lies; you are worthless physicians, all of you! If only you would be altogether silent!'

"Your suffering is for your own good," says Elihu.

'God does all these things to a person - twice, even three times - to turn back his soul from the pit, that the light of life may shine on him' (33:29).

WHERE is the voice of God?

9:22-24 — Does God destroy the good right along with the bad. When calamity hits and brings sudden death, does he fold his arms, aloof from the despair of the innocent? He lets the wicked take over running the world, he installs judges who can't tell right from wrong. If God's not responsible, who is?'

Job 38-41: God speaks out of the storm

 $\underline{\bf 38:2}$ - "Who is this that darkens my counsel with words without knowledge?"

38:3 - "Brace yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer me'.

38:4 - "Where were you when I laid the foundations of the earth? Tell me, if you know so much".

38:5-7 - "Do you know how its dimensions were determined and who did the surveying? What supports its foundations, and who laid its cornerstone, as the morning stars sang together and all the angels shouted for joy?"

38: 19-21 - "Do you know where Light comes from and where Darkness lives
So you can take them by the hand and lead them home when they get lost?
Why, of course you know that.
You've known them all your life, grown up in the same neighbourhood with them!

38:34-35 - "Can you get the attention of the clouds, and commission a shower of rain?

Can you take charge of the lightning bolts and have them report to you for orders?

39:19-20 - 'Do you give the horse its strength or clothe its neck with a flowing mane?

20 Do you make it leap like a locust, striking terror with its proud snorting?

39:26-27 - "Was it through your know-how that the hawk learned to fly? Did you command the eagle's flight, and teach her to build her nest in the heights, Perfectly at home on the high cliff face, invulnerable on pinnacle and craq?

40:1-2 - The LORD said to Job: 'Will the one who contends with the Almighty correct him? Let him who accuses God answer him!'

40:4 - "I am unworthy - how could I ever find the answers? I lay my hand upon my mouth in silence. I have said too much already"

42:1-6 - Job bows in reverent submission and confesses 3 great truths:

Verse 1-2: Job confesses the truth that God is absolutely sovereign:
 'I know that you can do all things; no purpose of yours can be thwarted' (NIV).

2. **Verse 3:** Job submits to God's greater wisdom and knowledge: .

You asked, "Who is this that obscures my plans without knowledge?"
Surely I spoke of things I did not understand,
things too wonderful for me to know.

3. **Verses 4–6**: Job stops questioning God and accepts his will:

You said, "Listen now, and I will speak;
I will question you,
and you shall answer me."

⁵My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you.

⁶Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes.'
